

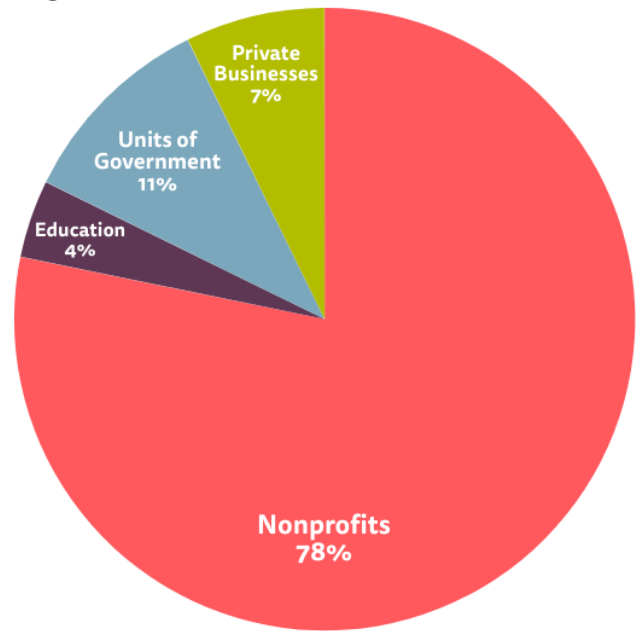
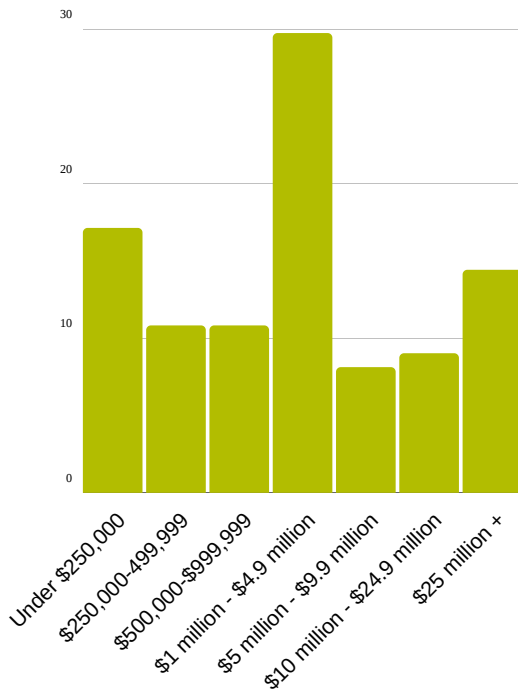
COVID-19 Impact on Indiana Organizations

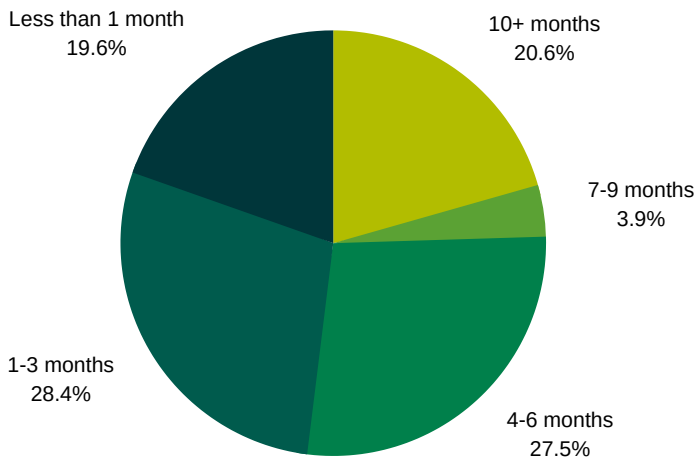
The Demographics

Annual Operating Budget



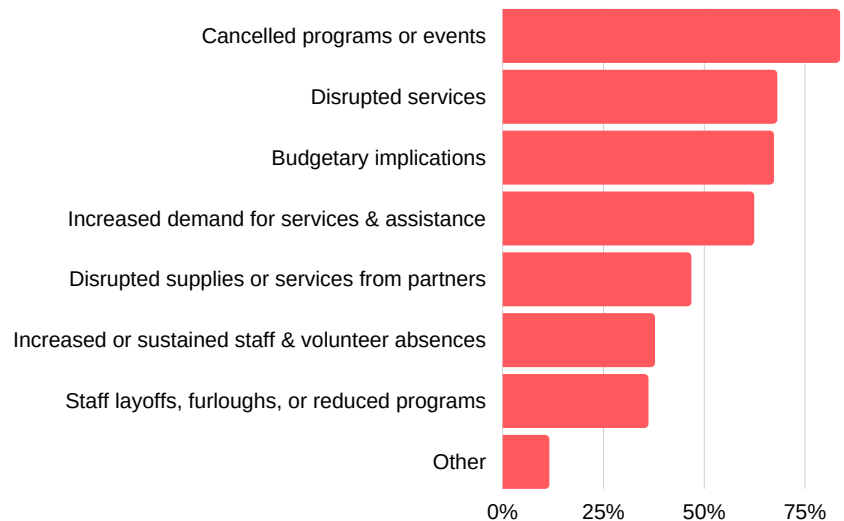
Organization Representation

Months of Cash Reserves on Hand

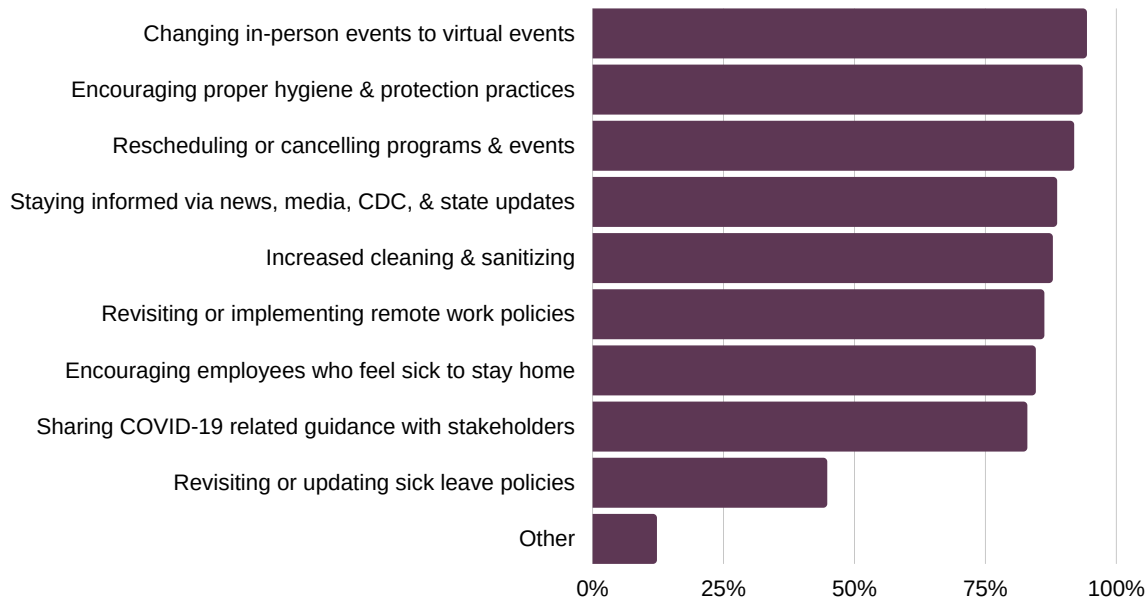
What Organizations are Experiencing
