

Executive Director's Letter

My mom's Facebook page is an interesting place. A mix of ideas are shared that I both agree with and cringe at, depending on the content. Maybe that can be said of most moms' FB pages? Maybe it can be said of mine? But yesterday, my mama shared a "story" that I hadn't heard that I think is actually worth a "share". It goes like this:

"A professor gave a balloon to every student, who had to inflate it, write their name on it and throw it in the hallway. The professor then mixed all the balloons. The students were then given 5 minutes to find their own balloon. Despite the hectic search, no one found their balloon.



At that point, the professor told the students to take the first balloon they found and hand it to the person whose name was written on it. Within 5 minutes, everyone had their own balloon.

The professor said to the students: 'These balloons are like happiness. We will never find it if everyone is looking for their own. But if we care about other people's happiness, we'll find ours too."

Here's the twist: Replace "happiness" with "success" or "prosperity" or whatever you would say you're pursuing through your work and in your community and switch up a few other words, and I think we have a poignant illustration for the field...

"These balloons are like organizational success or community prosperity. We will never find it, if everyone is pursuing it on their own. But if we care about others' success/prosperity (or look outside of ourselves/our organizations/our communities in pursuing it), we'll find ours too."

I hat is power in our network. It's the power in the advocacy we do. It's the power in the resources we provide. And it's the power in the engagement opportunities we create. It's also the reason the theme we've chosen for our 2022 summit is "Connect to Effect: Building an Equitable Economy for All Hoosiers".

Because the power that each of us holds to make an impact is multiplied when we connect it to – and build on – the work of others. COVID-19 Housing Resources

- The CDC's Eviction Moratorium has been overturned by the U.S. Supreme Court and
 is no longer valid as of August 26, 2021. Tenants are NOT protected from eviction due
 to nonpayment of rent at this time.
- For a complete list of and links to the state's various emergency rental assistance programs, visit the Housing4Hoosiers <u>COVID-19 Assistance & Resources</u> page.
- The Indiana Legal Services Tenant Help Desk hotline is available every Thursday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. for the remainder of 2021. For more information, view the flyer.
- The <u>Indy Affordable Modification Program (IndyAMP)</u> allows Marion County homeowners negatively affected by COVID-19 to refinance mortgage debt at a belowmarket interest rate for up to 30 years. IndvAMP allows owners to remain in their

homes, become current with their mortgages, and lower their monthly payments.

 <u>COVID-19 Resources for Homeowners</u> provides information for FHA-insured mortgages on the foreclosure moratorium and how to apply for mortgage forbearance.

Employee Retention Tax Credit

On Aug. 4, the IRS issued further guidance on the employee retention credit, including guidance for employers who pay qualified wages after June 30, 2021, and before Jan. 1, 2022, and issues that apply to the employee retention credit in both 2020 and 2021.

Notice 2021-49 amplifies prior guidance regarding the employee retention credit provided in Notice 2021-20 and Notice 2021-23.

The new guidance addresses changes made by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to the employee retention credit that are applicable to the third and fourth quarters of 2021.

The 2021 Central Indiana Salary Survey has been released to the public. More than 286 area nonprofits participated in the 2021 survey. The survey solicits compensation and benefits information for 26 common nonprofit positions and then segments the information based on organization size, by either annual budget or number of staff.

IHCDA Increases HTF Opportunities

IHCDA is aware that cost increases are impacting the financial feasibility of **National Housing Trust** Fund ("HTF") funded developments. In order to respond to these cost increases in a manner that serves developer partners, IHCDA will offer increases of up to \$500,000 in additional HTF for developments with already approved **National Housing Trust** Fund ("HTF") grants. Only developments that have already received HTF are eligible to request additional HTF through this policy.
